

## Storage Recovery Study

Pueblo Reservoir opened in 1975 and has been a wonderful amenity for all of Southeastern Colorado. Not only is it the terminal storage for Fryingpan-Arkansas Project water, but it provides a quality recreation experience for boaters from all over the country. Like any reservoir, it is prone to sedimentation. **This sedimentation could affect storage before the end of this century, so the Southeastern District and Bureau of Reclamation have proactively undertaken a study to find ways to prevent future losses and to recover storage that has already been lost.**

The District completed Phases I & II of this study in 2020 and 2021.

Phase III of the study will begin in 2023. The District has issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) until April 24, 2023, for a Tributary Risk Assessment, sediment source sample analysis, future sediment source control alternatives analysis and analysis of reservoir modifications to recover storage.
